It is recommended that any appropriation herein or heretofore made for projects and programs within the purview of the 'Emergency Transportation Tax Act, "P.L. 1961, c. 32 (C54:8-1 et seq.), as determined by the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting, first be charged to the Transportation Fund established in such Act.

It is further recommended that receipts representing the State share from the rental or lease of property, and the unexpended balances as of June 30, 1989 of such receipts, be appropriated for maintenance or improvement of transportation property, equipment and facilities.
